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INTRODUCTION

I remember vividly how I felt as I sat in the wheelchair at the Women's Hospital waiting for my husband to pull the car up. My arms were empty and yet they felt heavy. "No woman who has just given birth should have to leave the labor and delivery ward with empty arms." I thought. The ache in my heart felt more painful than any physical pain I had felt in the past.

I bit my lip to keep the nurse who was with me from seeing my grief. I knew the situation already made her uncomfortable. She was used to wheeling happy families out to their cars, with baby in arms, awaiting their new life full of hopes and dreams.

My dreams had been dashed earlier that day as I held my tiny premature son and whispered my goodbyes only 6 short hours after his birth. I never dreamed I would lose a child and I didn't know how I would survive the brokenness I felt.

Here I am all these years later and I have survived. I look back on those days of deep grief and they stir up feelings of missing and sadness but also peace and hope.

I wonder about the little boy I don't know and I think about what I have missed in a life without him. In the next moment I smile because I did have him briefly and loved him (love him) dearly. Peace comes when I think about how faithful God has been to heal my heart and carry me through all that the loss of a child brings with it.

I look back and I see how my faith has grown in my Heavenly Father who, not only rescued me from those dark days, but also sat there with me in them. He showed me how deeply He cared about me and also how much He loved my son.

In all of my struggles to understand why things happened the way they did God showed me grace and let me see the truth in His Word about loss and grief.

If you are reading this now because of your own loss my prayer is that, even though you are grieving, you sense the presence of God who cares so deeply for you and the child you lost. No depth of despair is too deep for Him to meet you, comfort you, and surround you with peace.

Over time the pain does lessen. I promise it does. But the missing stays and sadness comes and goes. Even with grief and sadness you can be whole again and have a heart that mends.

These pages contain my prayer for you as you walk through these next steps in life. They are not only my desire for you but God's heart and His truth for you from His Word.
